What is an Action Plan?

- The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) requirement designed to help states and local jurisdictions assess community needs and market conditions to guide investment.
- Requires **public input to identify housing and community development priorities** for block grant programs, including the CDBG, HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG).
- This Consolidated Plan will cover the five-year period from 2023 2028 for the Los Angeles Urban County.
 - ☐ This is the third year of implementation.







Cost Burden




Household with Lower Income

30%	Personal entertainment, cell phone, cable, gym membership, eating out, leisure travel	\$25,976




